

## **Upcoming site investigations at Kippax Group Centre**

Dear resident,

The ACT Government will undertake further site assessments in the week commencing 6 April 2021 to inform the future expansion of the Kippax Group Centre and planning for new or upgraded community facilities. These assessments have been recommended as a result of site investigations undertaken in early March 2021.

As you may know, the 2019 Kippax Group Centre Master Plan and 2020 Territory Plan Variation (number 361) provided for changes in land uses to allow for this expansion and for new community facilities. ## What will the site investigations involve?

Private contractors will undertake geotechnical and environmental assessments, as well as soil sampling on Section 51 and Section 88 as per the map above. Weather permitting, the work is scheduled to run from 6 April 2021 until 14 April 2021. You can expect to see activity on site from **7am** each workday during this period. This work will involve the use of a truck mounted rig to drill boreholes across the sites.

Consultants wearing high visibility clothing will also be present on site to supervise the drilling and take measurements and soil samples. You will see some equipment and vehicles parked on the site. To minimise any disruption or inconvenience, all appropriate traffic, cyclist and pedestrian management, including all safety precautions, will be implemented while the work is being carried out.
